Belstar Second Quarter Activities

Mr. Dan Belcher, Jr., attended the Virginia Transportation Construction Alliance (VTCA) 2025 Dialogue with the Richmond District. This Dialogue was held on Tuesday, May 13, 2025, at the Virginia Crossings Hotel in Glen Allen, Virginia. The Dialogue was well attended by industry consultants and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) staff.

The attendees had the opportunity to meet industry peers, VDOT's district staff leadership, and local government leaders for networking, education, and discussions. Richmond District Engineer, Mr. Dale Totten, PE, hosted the program along with leadership staff and industry representatives. The program covered the District's latest program news, leadership vision, partnering philosophy, and goals for delivering the District's program.

Highlights from the Dialogue included topics on safety, communication, and building

teamwork within the industry. Discussions were held regarding work on and around I-95 and the use of the design-build process (turn-key projects and task orders). The Central Virginia Transportation Alliance (CVTA) discussed several current projects and how a portion of Virginia's sales tax has allowed their work to move forward.

One of the major discussions was the importance of teamwork between VDOT and the consultant industry members. By working together, current and future projects stay on track to meet timelines and/or deadlines.

This year, the program was held in the afternoon and concluded with a special networking session allowing face-to-face meetings with industry and VDOT program staff. The very informative roundtable discussions are typically sold out. Some of the topics for this Dialogue included:

- Alternative Project Delivery
- Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI)
- Central Region Operations, Construction, Locally Administered Projects
 - Maintenance, Preliminary Engineering, and Structure and Bridge

The next VTCA meeting is the Annual Meeting being held at the Greenbrier in West Virginia on June 19-22, 2025.

Gina Welc attended two information webinars in the second quarter.

The first was *Mastering Compliance: Guide to Annual Reports and Business Licenses*, presented by CSC.

Topics included the difference between filing annual reports and business licenses, compliance challenges, and consequences of noncompliance.

The second was *Understanding the Role and Responsibilities of a Plan Fiduciary*, presented by Manulife | John Hancock.

The head of defined contribution consulting and the director / senior ERISA consultant covered the fiduciary duties ERISA creates for plan professionals and strategies for navigating through the fast-changing regulatory environment.

Ms. Welc found both to be interesting and informative!
